

Hops Research Updates

FUN FACT - Unlike Pacific Northwest or other hops production regions, Florida can produce hops **twice** a year. After the spring harvest in June, plants immediately grew new shoots, which have already reached the 18-ft cable.





Be on the lookout for burrowing owls on your strawberry farms. Hillsborough County once led the nation in burrowing owl counts but now, they are a threatened species due to development pressures.

The Tampa Audubon Society is putting the word out. The owls especially like old agric. fields, so we're hoping local farmers might be able to help us locate more of them. We went out and built artificial burrows for the one I spotted back in January, and we're happy to say he has moved into one of them but appears to be a very lonely owl. It would be great to find others in the county.
