Butterfly Nursery at GCREC

Outside the breakroom of the main building, there are a couple of trellises where several passion flower vines are growing. These plants attract Gulf fritillary, Agraulis vanillae (Linnaeus), a brightly colored butterfly common across extreme southern portions of the United States. At home in most open, sunny habitats, it frequents roadsides, disturbed sites, fields, open woodlands, pastures, yards, and parks. It is a regular in most butterfly gardens, including those in more urban settings. There have already been dozens of these butterflies born here at GCREC. Watch it happen from the windows of the breakroom. Quite stunning.
